FYI: There are currently 32,000 Little Free Library book exchanges around the world. They are represented in all 50 states and over 70 countries. To date, over 35 million books have been exchanged worldwide through Little Free Library book exchanges.

Who is The Prickly Pear Little Free Library for? Everyone! It's a community library for anyone who lives in the general area of the library, neighbors, kids, the curious, anyone who walks by, stewards of other Little Free Libraries, out of towners, etc.

What are the hours of The Prickly Pear Little Free Library? The library is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Do you keep track of visitors? I don't keep track of visitors.

I see a book I like, what do I do? If you see a book in the library you like, just take it out of the library and take it home. Plan to either return it or perhaps bring another book to replace the one you took. There's no book "check out" or tracking of who takes a particular book, or when.

Can I take more than one book? Yes.

Can kids take books from the library? Yes! There are children's books in the library. Kids are welcome library visitors!

When do I need to return a book I've taken? Return it whenever you have time or are finished with it.

What if I forget to ever bring back a book I took? No problem. No late fees or lost book fees!

Can I donate books to the library? Yes! Donations are encouraged! If you'd like to donate books to keep the library stocked please either place the book(s) in the library if there is room or set them on the bench on the front porch. Books for both children and adults are much appreciated! PLEASE NO textbooks, old books that are falling apart or missing pages, pornography, or political or religious materials such as leaflets or pamphlets. When you donate a book to a Little Free Library, you're essentially saying goodbye to your book, so don't donate anything special or valuable to you. Donations are important to keeping the stock of available books fresh to regular visitors. Feel free to donate anonymously or let Penny know who the donation(s) came from.

I donated books, but I don't see them in the library. Why? There's limited room in the library, so books may have to be circulated in. It's likely your donation hasn't rotated in yet. Or maybe your donation was circulated in and already taken!

Can I set up a Little Free Library of my own? Yes, of course! The more, the merrier! There are tons of Little Free Libraries around Tucson, the United States, and in other countries. Visit **www.littlefreelibrary.org** to get started!

How can I help?
